

Rolf's hobby is ham radio, and he showed his "telegraphic" keys, modern ones to the left and an old favorite to his to the right. Liza showed off treasured crystal pieces she got as gifts from her parents.







Elaine showed off her collection of the Swedish Majblomma the annual May flower pin that is sold every year by school children to raise money for charity. And a conductor cap that was given to her by family, and her genealogy records she found while visiting Sweden.

#### Why I came to America and why I stayed...

The reason I stayed actually started where I had my first job. It was at Åhlen & Åkerlund publishing company in Stockholm. It was responsible for several weekly and monthly magazines. One of those magazines had an international pen pal column. Since I already had pen pals in all three neighboring countries...I thought why not add someone from the US. This was 1954. I had another job by then.

In late 1956 the dailies were full of ads for au pair positions in England and the US. My girlfriend Barbro and I wanted to work in the US. I found an ad about a Mother's helper in New Jersey. My English was not very good, so my brother had to help me write the letter. After an interview and getting all necessary documents such as passport, proof from Stockholm police that I was not a criminal, a chest X-ray that I did not have TB and proof from my future employer that I had a job and a guarantee that I would not be a burden on the US government, I was ready to sail off to America on June 15, 1957!





My mother was not happy...why did I want to give up a good job to this unknown venture. I promised here it was only for a year. At that time I had two sisters and three brothers still at home.

The New Jersey family had four children and I was told they were expecting their fifth. They were very nice, and I soon became like a member of the family.

In April 1958, I had a one-week vacation and flew to Chicago to visit my aunt. While there my US pen pal drove down from Wisconsin. He invited me to visit Wisconsin. My plans were to return to Sweden in early summer 1958.

Those plans changed and I decided to stay one more year in New Jersey. Another week free to travel was offered in October so I flew to Wisconsin. Had a great time with my pen pal, his family and friends. Oh and by the way at the end of that week my pen pal Richard proposed to me!!!!!!!

#### Translate Gök = Cuckoo bird • Otta= Dawn (CuckooDawn)

Gökotta is traditionally practiced the first day of Ascension (in May) through midsummer, but there's no reason why it can't inspire us for mornings during other seasons. Ideally, you get up with the birds at the crack of dawn, between 4 and 6am. to experience the stillness of the morning and appreciate the beauty of nature, particularly birdsong. Studies have shown that being around nature can improve our health, reduce feelings of isolation, and increase community cohesion. To experience the benefits of *gökotta* and "nature therapy," try camping, spending time in a garden, or leaving the city. (This section by Liza)

#### SWEDISH ABBA 1974 and 2024

## Celebrating 50 YEARS since the MUSIC started...

Known for global hits such as 'Mamma Mia' (1975), 'Dancing Queen' (1976) and 'The Winner Takes It All' (1980), the quartet was recognized for their "outstanding contributions to Swedish and international music." On May 31, 2024, they were each rewarded with Royal titles and the Royal Order of Vasa badge. The Royal Order of

Vasa (Swedish: Kungliga Vasaorden) is a Swedish order of chivalry founded on 29 May 1772 by King Gustav III.

1974 Björn, Agnetha, Anni-Frid, and Benny





On May 31, 2024, Legendary Swedish pop band ABBA (Björn, Agnetha, Anni-Frid, and Benny) received the Royal Order of Vasa (see the badge above) from the Swedish King Carl XVI Gustaf and Queen Silvia as well as Royal titles. This took place at a conferment ceremony, in the banquet hall Vita Havet of The Royal Palace of Stockholm. Each was awarded as "Artists Benny Andersson, Agnetha Fältskog, Anni-Frid Reuss, and Björn Ulvaeus".

Commander of First Class of the Royal Order of Vasa

"For very distinguished achievements in Swedish and international music life"

To comprehend and grasp how distinguished an award this is, it is the equivalent to becoming knighted in the Anglo-Saxon Royal tradition.

It was a rare event to find the group together.

In 1975, Sweden ceased awarding this order to its own citizens, deeming it too dated, although foreign nationals were not affected. The practice was reinstated by Parliament in 2022.

The foursome, known collectively by their initials ABBA, represented the disco years with their unique style and catchy melodies, until their split in 1982. Their prolificacy, with eight albums released in as many active years, and their accessibility – they welcomed journalists into their private lives – secured them a unique place in Swedish music history.
